Outlet Pipe Update

The project to clear the lake outlet pipe under Nicolas Baudin Drv is scheduled to start in February 2021 using a team of three divers, an electrician, a jetvac machine operator and several truck drivers.



The first task will be to cap both ends of

the outlet pipe and pump the water it contains into the lake. This will result in Nicolas Baudin Drv being closed for a few days as a hose will need to be laid from Joy Beer Park over to the lake.

The mussels will be removed by divers in the pipe using a jetvac machine which is an oversize water blaster. The mussels will be trucked away and dumped. They will possibly be sold to a garden supplies firm at some later date.

The project will take 5-7 days and result in machinery noise, trucks coming and going and a constant whirring sound from the pump.

Council will provide notice of the road closure and <u>residents of streets</u> off Nicolas Baudin Drv will need to use Encounter Tce for access during <u>this time</u>. The project result will be a huge increase in lake water flows.
